## God Calls His People and Reveals Himself

God calls His people to worship and come before Him. The Creator of all things reveals Himself through His Word and calls us into His presence.

# God Calls His People to Confession, Repentance, and Reconciliation

The People of God respond to His Word by confessing their sins, repenting of their sinful ways, and seeking God's favor through the reconciling work of Jesus, the Son of God.

## Prayer of Confession • Prov 3:11-12; 12:1; Psa 94:12; Heb 12:11; Prov 10:17; Psa 23:3

Leader: Father, your Word tells us that the mouth of the righteous is a fountain of life, but we have often used our words to wound and not to heal.

People: We have spoken hastily and carelessly, stirring up anger instead of peace.

Leader: You tell us that the one who conceals hatred has lying lips, yet we sometimes disguise

malice with flattery and deceit.

People: Rather than restrain our tongues, we sometimes multiply words without knowledge.

Leader: Like the reckless slashing of a sword we have spoken rashly, rather than seeking to

speak with wisdom and grace.

People: We have torn down rather than built up, and our words have brought death instead of life.

Leader: Tame our tongues, O Lord, for we are often incapable of governing them well.

All: Help blessing to flow from our mouths rather than cursing, and teach us to speak as

those redeemed by Your grace. Amen.

# God Teaches Us Through His Word

## Scripture Reading • Selections from Proverbs on the Tongue, Chapters 10-29

The mouth of the righteous is a fountain of life, but the mouth of the wicked conceals violence. (10:11)

There is one whose rash words are like sword thrusts, but the tongue of the wise brings healing. (12:18)

A gentle tongue is a tree of life, but perverseness in it breaks the spirit. (15:4)

Gracious words are like a honeycomb, sweetness to the soul and health to the body. (16:24)

To make an apt answer is a joy to a man, and a word in season, how good it is! (15:23)

A word fitly spoken is like apples of gold in a setting of silver. (25:11)

Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and those who love it will eat its fruits. (18:21)

The wise of heart will receive commandments, but a babbling fool will come to ruin. (10:8)

When words are many, transgression is not lacking, but whoever restrains his lips is prudent. (10:19)

Whoever guards his mouth preserves his life; he who opens wide his lips comes to ruin. (13:3)

Whoever restrains his words has knowledge,

and he who has a cool spirit is a man of understanding. (17:27)

Even a fool who keeps silent is considered wise; when he closes his lips, he is deemed intelligent. (17:28) Do you see a man who is hasty in his words? There is more hope for a fool than for him. (29:20)

Lying lips are an abomination to the Lord, but those who act faithfully are his delight. (12:22)

Truthful lips endure forever, but a lying tongue is but for a moment. (12:19)

A false witness will not go unpunished, and he who breathes out lies will not escape. (19:5)

A man who flatters his neighbor spreads a net for his feet. (29:5)

Faithful are the wounds of a friend; profuse are the kisses of an enemy. (27:6)

Whoever rebukes a man will afterward find more favor than he who flatters with his tongue. (28:23)

### Speak, O Lord



Whoever goes about slandering reveals secrets,

but he who is trustworthy in spirit keeps a thing covered. (11:13)

A dishonest man spreads strife, and a whisperer separates close friends. (16:28)

For lack of wood the fire goes out, and where there is no whisperer, quarreling ceases. (26:20)

The words of a whisperer are like delicious morsels; they go down into the inner parts of the body. (18:8)

The tongue of the righteous is choice silver; the heart of the wicked is of little worth. (10:20)

The lips of the righteous feed many, but fools die for lack of sense. (10:21)

The mouth of the righteous brings forth wisdom, but the perverse tongue will be cut off. (10:31)

The lips of the righteous know what is acceptable, but the mouth of the wicked, what is perverse. (10:32)

The heart of the righteous ponders how to answer,

but the mouth of the wicked pours out evil things. (15:28)

## God Sends His People Out to Be Light in Darkness


After calling His people into His presence, forgiving their sins, and instructing them in His Word, God sends His people into the world to show His light in the darkness.
