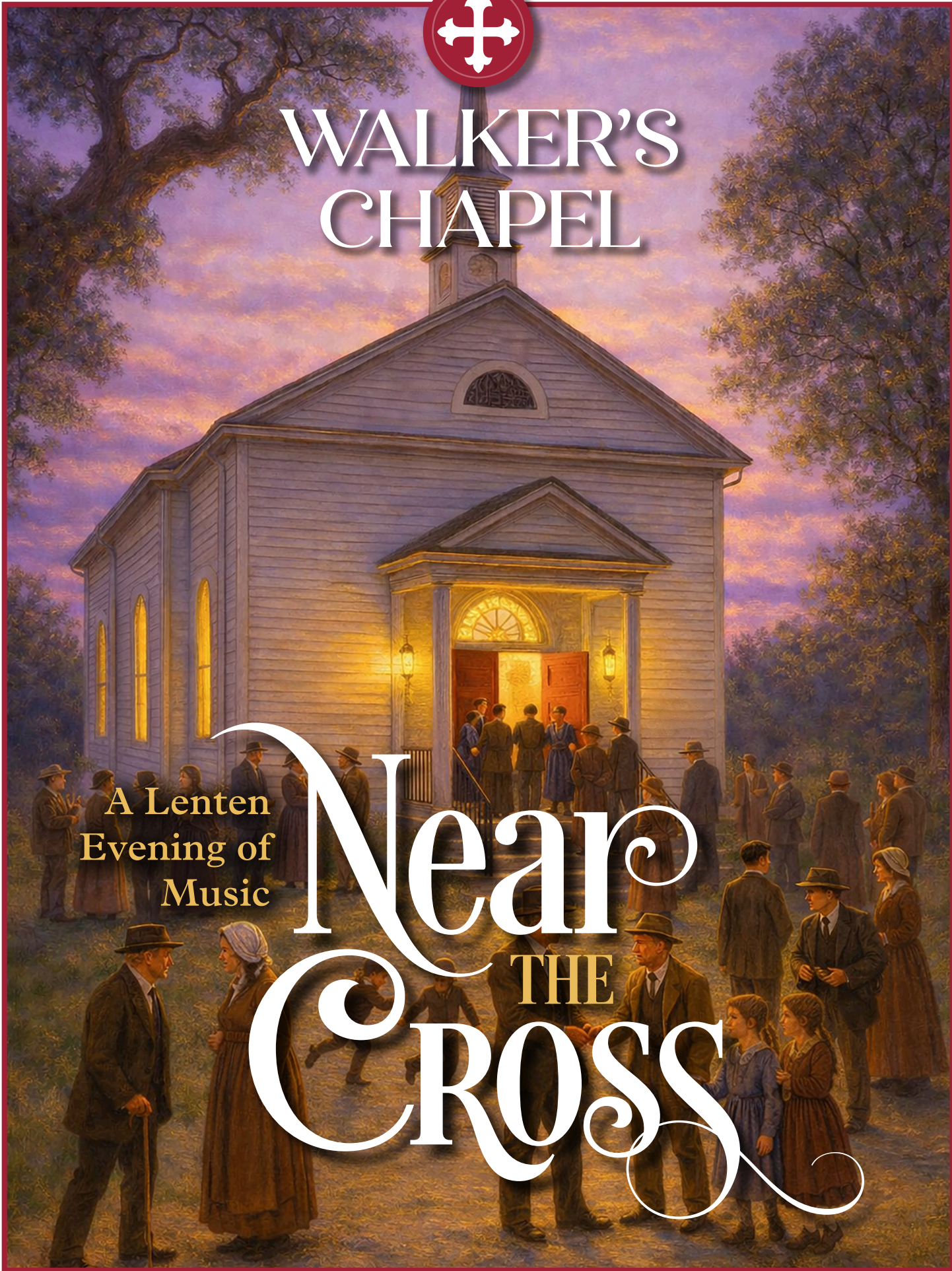

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!




